

**FY 2011 MEETING MINUTES OF THE
JOINT SERVICE RESERVE COMPONENT FACILITY BOARD
STATE OF ARIZONA**

A. CONVENING THE JSRCFB

In accordance with DOD Directive 1225.7.6, dated June 6, 2001, the Arizona Joint Service Reserve Component Board (JSRCFB) held a meeting convening at 1405 hours on 18 April 2011 at the 162nd AFW CES/CC, 1350 E. Perimeter Way, Tucson, AZ. The meeting was chaired by MAJ David Brothers, USMCR.

F. DISCUSSION

Following introductions, the JSRCFB Chair, Maj David Brothers, USMCR, asked each organization to review their projects on the list. Only two projects had been added to the list for FY11. These include the AZARNG MEDCOM add/alt and the USMCR MCAS Yuma project. Both of these are unilateral projects. The Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) FY10 Silverbell Army Heliport (SBAH) Armed Forces Readiness Center (AFRC) project between the AZ Army National Guard (AZARNG) and US Army Reserve (USAR) still remains the only joint project on the list. However, since the project should be completed this summer, it will be removed from the FY11 list.

Each service component provided an overview of their current, near, and long range projects:

The USAR has a project (#12331) that has a to-be-determined (TBD) program year, which requires land for construction. They are trying to locate approximately 15 acres of land in the northwest Phoenix area; possibly utilizing Bureau of Land Management (BLM) or AZARNG property on Papago Park Military Reservation (PPMR). Luke AFB would probably be an acceptable area as well. This project is listed as unilateral, but has the potential to be joint. The USAR is estimating a 54,000 SF facility for 400 personnel.

The US Air Force Reserves (USAFR) has no new projects at this time.

The AZ Air National Guard (AZANG) continues to work its three projects in FY11. There is the \$18M FY12 Congressional Add project relocating an access point and Munitions Ammo Storage (MSA) facility at Davis Monthan AFB in Tucson, AZ. The FY09 Davis Monthan Predator Beddown project (FBNV069124), is nearly complete; and an FY11 Predator Hangar project (HFHA069169) on Libby Army Air Field at Fort Huachuca which was in design, has been put on hold while the Army reevaluates the facility's location. Dr Blaes has noted that there is a 75 acre parcel at Pinal Air Park that may be a possible location for the stalled Ft Huachuca project and could become a possible joint ANG/ARNG project.

The AZARNG is in the process of requesting a location change on a FY15 Readiness Center project (#040035), from Mohave County/Kingman to Sierra Vista/Fort Huachuca or other site. The project is currently identified/funded as unilateral, but has the potential to be joint pending final site. Another Readiness Center project (#040038) projected for FY16 at Safford also has the potential to be joint. LTC Moscarello advised that this project will be for an engineering unit, and that it will be located on approximately 400 acres of engineering training lands. A TBD MEDCOM add/alt was also added to the list this year. Timing is most likely not earlier than FY18, and is a unilateral project. All Grow the Army (GTA) projects were removed from the list as they near completion.

The US Naval Reserves advised they only have the one FY10 Readiness Center on Luke AFB (#P600), which is nearly complete and should be removed from the project list. Mr Raoufpur noted that the next project they were looking into was going to be in San Jose, CA. Maj Brothers also has a San Jose land issue, and was going to talk with Mr Raoufpur off line. Dr Blaes advised that she would send the CAARNG FMO contact information to Mr Raoufpur to see if the Guard had any insight on San Jose land. The AZARNG still expresses an interest in the future land disposal of the Naval Reserve Center, located at 1201 North 35th Ave, Phoenix, AZ 85009. Mr Raoufpur has requested that an inquiry email be sent to him.

The USMCR also expressed an interest in the Naval Reserve Center for locating a UAV unit. Maj Brothers also identified a new project which is MCAS Yuma, a UAS Training Center (#P123). USMCR expects no Congressional plus-ups; therefore, this \$6M project will remain in FY13. There was also discussion about the possibility of launch and recover operations at Cannon near Yuma. The possibility of joint training areas with the AZARNG was also discussed. The USMCR is looking at various national level training opportunities.

G. TASKINGS

AZARNG is to send a memo to Mr Raoufpur expressing an interest in the Naval Reserve Center.

H. NEXT MEETING

It was agreed that the revolving Chair/host list previously developed will be retained; the following agencies will perform that JSRB duty in the indicated years:

- 2012 – USAR, 63D RSC, Phoenix, AZ
- 2013 – Air Force Reserve, Phoenix AZ
- 2014 – Arizona Army National Guard, Phoenix, AZ
- 2015 – Arizona Air National Guard, 161st AW/CES, Phoenix, AZ
- 2016 – Naval Reserve, Phoenix, AZ
- 2017 – Marine Corps Reserve, Phoenix, AZ

The next meeting is tentatively set for 25 Mar 2012, at a time and location TBD, with the US Army Reserves.
