

MEETING MINUTES
JOINT SERVICE RESERVE COMPONENT FACILITY BOARD
(STATE OF MARYLAND)

13 May 2015

A. CONVENING THE BOARD

In accordance with the DOD Directive 1225.07, 23 April 2007, and DOD Instruction 1225.08, 6 September 2001, the Maryland Joint Service Reserve Component Facility Board convened on 15 April 2015 at 1402R, in the conference room of Building 2100, Warfield Air National Guard Base, Baltimore, Maryland 21220. Arrangements were also made for members to participate by audio bridge.

C. ACTION ON MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS. The minutes of the meeting of 23 April 2014 were reviewed. The 2014 minutes were authenticated by the board members in May 2014 and submitted to OSD. E. PROJECT LISTING. All projects considered by the board are found at Enclosure 1.

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F. PROJECT RECOMMENDATIONS. Projects reviewed are listed below by service, with JSRCFB comments.

DC Air National Guard

1. Munitions Load Crew Training Facility (PN #AJXF039040): \$5.20M. Construct a new facility at Joint Base Andrews for munitions crew training and corrosion control actions on F-16 aircraft. Originally programmed for FY16, the project is in design and on track for FY18 construction.

Not suited for other services' units/locations. JSRCFB recommends continue with programmed unilateral construction.

2. Mobility Processing Facility (PN #AJXF42039): \$1.80M. Construct a new administrative facility at Joint Base Andrews to support deployment actions. As of last year programmed for FY18, now shifted to FY20. Not in design yet.

Not suited for other services' units/locations. JSRCFB recommends continue with programmed unilateral construction.

3. Arm/De-Arm Pad (PN # ?): \$???M. Added to the list during the JSRCFB. Construct a new facility at Joint Base Andrews to support operations in FY??.

Not needed for other services' units/locations. JSRCFB recommends continue to plan for unilateral construction.

Maryland Army National Guard

1. Havre de Grace Readiness Center (PN #240165): \$16.65M. Construct a new 53,000+ SF multi-unit Readiness Center to replace the Readiness Center at the State Military Reservation in Havre de Grace, MD. Programmed for FY15.

Replaces existing facility that houses two units and a Battalion HQ. Not ideally suited for other services' units/locations. Includes federally-supported NGB-IH Activity, and state-supported Reservation Manager offices and a Veterans' Honor Guard Team. JSRCFB recommends unilateral construction.

2. Easton Readiness Center (PN #240173): \$17.30M. Construct a new 44,000+ SF Readiness Center to replace the Readiness Center in Easton, MD. Re-programmed from FY15 to FY16.

MDARNG will construct a replacement to support two units and a state Veterans' Honor Guard team. JSRCFB recommends unilateral construction.

3. Sykesville/Freedom Readiness Center (PN # 240149): \$25.3M. Construct a new 66,800+ SF multi-unit Readiness Center in Carroll County Freedom District on a new 56 acre parcel. Replaces two obsolete Readiness Centers (Ellicott City and Catonsville). Programmed for FY17, with potential to re-program in FY18. Prior discuss about joint construction with USAR, including potential for subsequent USAR add on to make this a joint National Guard/Reserve Center.

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Maryland Army National Guard

MDARNG and USAR have held discussions over two years on this project. At this point, USAR is no longer interested in this as a joint project, as focus has shifted to locations closer to the Baltimore metro area. JSRCFB recommends unilateral construction.

5. Combined Support Maintenance Shop (CSMS) Phase I (PN # 240147): \$20.0M. Construct a new 45,600 SF sustainment-level maintenance facility to replace some facilities within the CSMS Complex at the State Military Reservation in Havre de Grace, MD. Programmed for FY20.

MDARNG will construct a surface equipment maintenance facility to replace most of the existing facilities in the CSMS complex at Havre de Grace (less the automotive maintenance facility). Not suited for other services' units/locations. A replacement for the Automotive Facility within the existing complex will be addressed as a separate project. JSRCFB recommends unilateral construction.

6. Baltimore City (or Baltimore County) Joint National Guard/Reserve Center (PN # 240162): \$31.6M. Construct a new 79,000 SF multi-unit joint NGRC or Readiness Center on a new parcel of 20+ acres in Baltimore City (or possibly Baltimore County just outside the city). Replace two Readiness Centers in Parkville and Baltimore City (Cade). Shifted upward to TAG-MD #1 priority.

This project has been an ongoing subject of bilateral discussion between MDARNG and USMCR for nearly four years. Both services retain interest in a joint NGRC facility in the Baltimore metro area, to be constructed sometime between FY22-FY26, with most likely scenario FY23 or later. Discussion of joint construction have included an accompanying Vehicle Maintenance Facility (VMF).

This project occasioned an extended discussion by the 2015 JSRCFB. Mr. Porter, the USNR (NAVFAC MIDLANT) representative, indicated that both USNR and USMCR have an interest in a facility that could replace the USMCR center in Baltimore and NOSC Baltimore in that timeframe. USAR also has an interest in this project. The JSRCFB endorses this project as a good candidate for joint construction which could include MD Army National Guard, US Marine Corps Reserve, US Navy Reserve, US Army Reserve units.

The JSRCFB discussed potential new sites. One of particular interest is the current USAR site in the Curtis Bay area (in Baltimore County, just beyond the city border). Much of the land is owned by GSA but appears to be potentially available for development. Shoreline sections should be investigated for potential Navy use, although this is not absolutely vital. Mr. Porter will contact GSA

to determine current uses and plans, status of environmental studies, etc., on this property. USAR will provide environmental study related to the current USAR portion of the total site.

LTC Dement indicated that the MDARNG is still looking at prospective sites inside Baltimore City, with at least one good prospect in the northern quarter suggested by the city planning staff (a high school scheduled for closure in 2020 on a parcel of approximately 30 acres, with good road access). All interested services will consider other sites within the city. If the Maryland Military Department acquires a new site that hosts a joint facility, the MDARNG will be the lead (host) service.

CW5 Souchet (USMCR) stated that the USMCR unit(s) could be the 4th Combat Engineers, but might be others depending on service stationing and needs. Mr. Porter stated that NAVFAC MIDLANT will create a joint USNR/USMCR DD Form 1391 to lay out the facility requirements for both services. Mr. Lohan and Mr. Mortensen (USAR) will develop the USAR DD Form 1391 requirements. The MDARNG will utilize its own DD Form 1391, information about prospective sites, and the other services' DD Forms 1391 to produce a single Economic Analysis of Alternatives to support a joint project. The PDF and ECONPACK files can be shared with each participating service.

JSRCFB members agreed to continue four service discussion about this project as a good candidate for joint construction.

7. White Oak Readiness Center (PN # 240148): \$37.3M. Construct a new 98,600 SF multi-unit Readiness Center on the current 14-acre White Oak Readiness Center site. Replace Readiness Centers in White Oak, Greenbelt, and Adelphi. TAG-MD #2 priority.

MDARNG will construct a new multi-unit Readiness Center on the site of the existing White Oak facility. LTC Dement indicated that the MDARNG is open to this as a joint project, including the potential for moving to another site in the general vicinity. There was a discussion of incorporating units from the current USARC in Gaithersburg, but USAR representatives indicated that this was not high on their priority list. Board members concluded that this project currently does not meet other services' needs. JSRCFB recommends unilateral construction.

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U.S. Marine Corps Reserve

Baltimore City (or Baltimore County Northeast) Joint National Guard/Reserve Center (PN # 240162): USMCR costs are Unknown. Construct a new joint National Guard/Reserve Center (NGRC) for units located at the Baltimore USMC RTC. Not yet programmed.

Discussion (above) reiterated interest in this as a joint project. Potential for joint Vehicle Repair Facility (VRF) onsite. JSRCFB recommends joint construction.

U.S. Navy Reserve

Discussion (above) laid out NAVFAC MIDLANT desire to replace NOSC Baltimore within the next decade. Strong joint project potential in the Baltimore metro area. In bilateral discussion after the conclusion of the JSRCFB, MDARNG and USNR agreed to initially size a prospective joint facility for the possibility of simultaneous drill by more than one service.

U.S. Army Reserve

USAR did not provide a current list prior to the board. The list considered this year reviewed the projects from the prior year, and representatives updated the projects' status during the meeting.

1. USARC Aberdeen Proving Ground (APG) (PN # CAR12-12129/CAR 13-67705): \$20.20M. Construct a 500-member Army Reserve Center at APG. Includes land, training building, Organizational Maintenance Shop (OMS), and unheated storage building. Replaces several obsolete USAR facilities in Maryland. Programmed for FY13, then shifted to FY15.

Project is under contract. Not suited for other services' needs. JSCRFB endorses continued unilateral construction.

2. USARC Curtis Bay (PN # 19985/CAR 13-68077): \$19.4M. Construct a 46,000 SF Add/Alt to existing facility on 27-acre site at Curtis Bay.

This site was the focus of earlier discussion about joint construction. If joint construction can be coordinated, it would most likely take the place of this project. USAR is interested in onsite replacement with a larger joint facility incorporating one or more of the interested services. USAR is also willing to look at sites within Baltimore City if the Maryland Military department takes the lead on property acquisition.

3. Project Name (PN # CAR12-10961 / CAR 14-67663): \$25.50M. Construct a new 600-soldier Army Reserve Center (ARC) in Riverdale, MD, to replace Annapolis ARC (12,956 SF), Riverdale USARC (30,603 SF) and Upper Marlboro ARC (31,689 SF). Programmed for FY14.

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Project is in design. Not suited for other services' units/locations. JSRCFB recommends continue with programmed unilateral construction.

4. Project Name (PN # CAR 18-77135): \$20.1M. Construct a new US Army Reserve Center (USARC) in Gaithersburg, MD. Projected for FY23.

Project is projected for FY23 but will most likely be much later. Not currently suited for other services' needs, but may have joint potential in a few years as other (currently higher priority) projects are programmed and completed. JSRCFB recommends unilateral construction at this time.

U.S. Air Force Reserve

The Air Force Reserve did not attend the FY15 JSRCFB. No projects were submitted for consideration by this year's board.

Maryland Air National Guard

1. Cyber/ISR and NWS Facility (PN #PJMS129058): \$12.90M. Construct a new Cyber/ISR Network Warfare Group (NWG) facility to support new missions at Warfield Air National Guard Base in Middle River, MD. Programmed for FY14.

This project is nearly completed its design and scheduled to start construction in September. It will be a secure facility and not well suited for other services' units/locations. JSRCFB continues to endorse unilateral construction.

2. Network Warfare Squadron Facility (PN #MMMD12973): \$3.7M. Construct a new facility at Fort Meade, MD, to support the MDANG Network Warfare Squadron. Co-located with USCYBERCOM.

Project is moving forward; better suited for joint construction with active component elements at Fort Meade, but there have been no good candidates. JSRCFB endorses unilateral construction.

3. Dining Facility (PN #PJMS929916): \$8.80M. Construct a new dining facility to support elements at Warfield Air National Guard Base in Middle River, MD. Re-programmed to FY27 or later.

Project is deferred. JSRCFB recommends unilateral construction.

4. Security Forces Building (PN #PJMS029019): \$4.3M. Construct a new facility at Warfield Air National Guard Base in Middle River, MD. Re-programmed to FY27 or later.

Project is deferred. JSRCFB recommends unilateral construction.

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Maryland Air National Guard

5. Relocate Munitions Complex (PN #PJMS959522): \$1.80M. Replace existing facility in a new location at Warfield Air National Guard Base in Middle River, MD. Re-programmed to FY27 or later.

Project is deferred. JSRCFB recommends unilateral construction.

6. Base Civil Engineer Maintenance Facility (PN #PJMS929715): \$2.3M. Construct a new BCE maintenance facility at Warfield Air National Guard Base in Middle River, MD. Projected for FY20.

Project is likely for FY20. Supports existing base population; without other services there this does not support others services' units and missions. JSRCFB recommends unilateral construction.

G. OTHER BUSINESS.

Warfield Air National Guard Base. Changes in aircraft distribution across the Air Force are affecting all states of the Air National Guard. A reduction in flying force structure in the MDANG may result in excess facility space at Warfield Air National Guard Base.

The board discussed the potential for moving other service units and functions to base. One specific topic of discussion was the potential to re-locate the MDARNG 32nd Civil Support team from Fort Meade to Warfield. This may be a good idea at some point, but there is still a great deal of uncertainty about the number and type of aircraft at the base (or even if there will be any aircraft at all). There was discussion about other types of aircraft such as UAVs (Army/Marine Corps/Navy) and Marine Corps aircraft. Nothing currently appears to be a good candidate to move to this location. Any decision about introducing other (flying or non-flying) elements at this site should be deferred until there is more clarity about future aircraft fielding across the Air Force.

H. NEXT MEETING.

1. MDARNG agrees to chair the FY16 Maryland JSRCFB.
2. The FY16 Maryland JSRCFB will be conducted on Wednesday, 27 April 2016.
2. Start Time and Location will be determined later and disseminated to the members. The JSRCFB will incorporate an audio bridge capability.

I. ADJOURNMENT. The FY15 Maryland JSRCFB adjourned at 1525.

J. AUTHENTICATION.

1. MDARNG will collate the official minutes of the board and seek signatures from the representative services. This will be sent as an MS Word file with a box in which members can sign by CAC if desired. Ink signature is also accepted, although this will require the signatory to scan and send the authentication page as an Adobe .PDF to the MDARNG admin support staff.
