

2016 BOARD MEETING MINUTES OF THE JOINT SERVICE RESERVE COMPONENT FACILITY BOARD (JSRCFB) NEW HAMPSHIRE

A. CONVENING THE JSRCFB

In accordance with DOD Directive 1225.07, dated 6 June 2001, Certified Current as of April 23, 2007 and per last years board recommended meeting format, the Board held its annual Joint Service RC Facility Board Meeting via audio conference at the Construction and Facilities Management Office at 1 Minuteman Way, New Hampshire, at 10:00 am on **14 April 2016**. CPT Matt Henry, NHARNG, read the board purpose as written in DoDI 1225.8, "The mission for the Joint Service Reserve Component Facility Board (JSRCFB) is to maximize usage of Reserve component land, facilities, and installations by promulgating joint use by two or more components. Additionally, the JSRCFB shall pursue opportunities for shared use with any Active components in their area."

B. ATTENDANCE

Participants are authenticated by Attachment 1. In accordance with DOD Instructions 1225.8, the Board convened with representatives from the Marine Corps Reserves, Air National Guard, Army Reserve, and Army National Guard residing in New Hampshire. There is no Air Force Reserve unit presence in New Hampshire.

C. ACTION ON MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETINGS

Minutes of the previous meeting held 7 May 2015 were accepted without change.

See Attachment 2, Project Listing. Ed Sargent summarized ARNG projects. Lt. Col. Eugene Mozzoni summarized ANG projects. USAR & USMCR did not have projects to review.

F. PROJECT RECOMMENDATIONS

1. NH ARNG PN # 330043 - Construction of a new Pembroke Readiness Center is accepted on the FYDP for FY19. The plan is to build a single unit Readiness Center in the Pembroke Area and eliminate severe overcrowding in the Concord facility. No other components had any interest in joint utilization and voted for the project to remain, **unilateral construction**, due to the fact that other components had adequate facilities and the proposed location was not favorable.
2. NH ARNG PN# 330050 - Construction of Readiness Center Space at the Army Aviation Support Facility (AASF) is accepted on the FYDP for FY20. This Project will help eliminate overcrowding in its existing Concord facilities. No other components had any interest in joint

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utilization and voted for the project to remain, **unilateral construction**, due to the fact that other components had adequate facilities and the proposed location was not favorable.

3. NHARNG PN # 330022 – Construction of a vehicle maintenance shop in the Littleton, NH area. This is the TAG's number one priority for Army National Guard construction. This project is to renovate the existing vehicle maintenance shop and construct an addition in order to meet authorizations. No other components have interest in joint utilization and this project will be **unilateral construction**.
4. NHARNG PN 330399 – Construction of a single unit Readiness Center in Littleton, NH area. This is the TAG's number two priority for Army National Guard construction. This project will construct a readiness center for a HiMARS Battery in order to replace an outdated facility in Berlin, NH. No other components have interest in joint utilization and this project will be **unilateral construction**.
5. NHARNG PN 330365 – NHARNG and USAR both have replacement of Keene facilities on their long range construction plan. Last year's board recommendation was joint construction with Army Reserve being the lead. Mr. Lohan noted the project remains low on their priority list for construction and likely not to be funded by 2024. However COL Mikolaities stated the state is currently pursuing land acquisition for NHARNG in Keene, elevating the urgency of the project. Mr. Lohan stated if NHARNG was to acquire land it would help him execute his project. It was decide NHARNG would now lead, as they have a higher priority, and future planning meetings will be scheduled. The project was reaffirmed, **joint construction**.
6. NHARNG PN 330446 - Readiness Center Add/Alt. Currently the Medical Detachment is in an overcrowded administration building and not a readiness center. This project will relocate the unit into the same facility as Troop Command. Gross building square footage will be increased by adding exam rooms, storage and administrative areas. Project is unique to the Army National Guard and recommended **unilateral construction**.
7. NHARNG PN 330475 – Addition/Alteration of Ready Building. This project will construct an addition onto Building 2, Civil Support Team Ready Bays, in order to accommodate MTOE changes to vehicles and equipment. No other components have interest in joint utilization and this project will be **unilateral construction**.
8. NHARNG PN 330432 – Aviation Building. Building #241 at Pease Trade Port renovation to accommodate Det. 18 OSA needs. Plans include hanger space for 1 C-12 fixed wing and administration space. Current facility housing unit (AASF) is receiving additional air craft and will no longer meet space requirements. Lt. Col. Mozzoni expressed his concern regarding the lack of parking space for ARNG C-12 at the location proposed. COL Mikolaities asked the Air National Guard about the availability of existing hanger space at Pease Air National Guard base to complement construction. It was determined joint space would be beneficial and both agreed to future planning. Therefore this project was recommended **joint construction**.
9. NHARNG PN 330485 – Access Control Facility. The State Military Reservation current entrances are non-standard with antiterrorism force protection guidelines and require the

proposed changes for the safety and wellbeing of the personnel stationed there. Project is unique to the Army National Guard and recommended **unilateral construction**.

10. NHARNG PN 330055 - Readiness Center Add/Alt. The Readiness Center in Manchester is seriously undersized and the current home to the 39th Army Band. This project would relocate the Band to the State's Military Reservation and into the same facility as Troop Command. Gross building square footage will be increased by adding rehearsal rooms, storage and administrative areas. Project is unique to the Army National Guard and recommended **unilateral construction**.
11. NHARNG PN 330491 - Readiness Center Add/Alt. The Readiness Center in Center Strafford is seriously undersized for the Engineer Unit stationed there. An addition would increase the gross building square footage by adding multipurpose rooms, administration and storage space. Project is unique to the Army National Guard and recommended **unilateral construction**.
12. NHARNG PN 330158 - Readiness Center Add/Alt. The Readiness Center in Lebanon is seriously undersized and an addition would increase the gross building square footage by adding multipurpose rooms, administration and storage space. Project is unique to the Army National Guard and recommended **unilateral construction**.
13. NHARNG PN 330030 - Readiness Center Add/Alt. The Readiness Center in Rochester is seriously undersized for A Co. of the 3643rd BSB stationed there. An addition would increase the gross building square footage by adding multipurpose rooms, female latrine, administration and storage space. Project is unique to the Army National Guard and recommended **unilateral construction**.
14. NHARNG PN 330444 - Readiness Center Add/Alt. The Readiness Center in Franklin is seriously undersized for the HiMARS Battery stationed there. An addition would increase the gross building square footage by adding female latrines, multipurpose rooms, administration and storage space. Project is unique to the Army National Guard and recommended **unilateral construction**.
15. NHARNG PN 330041 - Readiness Center Add/Alt. The Readiness Center in Nashua is seriously undersized for the HiMARS Battery stationed there. An addition would increase the gross building square footage by adding female latrines, multipurpose rooms, administration and storage space. Project is unique to the Army National Guard and recommended **unilateral construction**.
16. NHARNG PN 330045 - is seeking MILCON to construct a Basic 25 Meter Rifle Baffled Range with twenty firing points at the Center Strafford Training Site. The range will be designed for training shot-grouping and zeroing exercises with rifles and machine guns. This range is used to train individual soldiers on the skills necessary to align the sights and practice basic marksmanship techniques against stationary targets. No other components have interest in joint utilization and this project will be **unilateral construction**.

17. NHARNG PN 330054 - is seeking MILCON to construct a Basic 31 Meter Rifle Baffled Range addition to their 5 lane range being constructed in this fiscal year at the Center Strafford Training Site. A range designed to meet training and qualification requirements with combat pistols and revolvers. This range is used to train and test soldiers on the skills necessary to identify, engage, and hit stationary infantry targets. Targets are not fully automated and/or the scenarios are not computer driven or scored. No other components have interest in joint utilization and this project will be **unilateral construction**.

18. NHARNG PN 330430 is seeking MILCON for to construct a Live Fire Exercise Shoothouse at the Center Strafford Training Site. The facility will be designed for training building clearing tasks associated with urban areas. This range is used to train and test individuals, teams, sections, or squads on the skills necessary to conduct individual and collective tasks of building clearing/occupying. All targets are fully automated, and the event-specific target scenario will be computer driven and scored from the range operations center. No other components have interest in joint utilization and this project will be **unilateral construction**.

19. NHANG PN SZCQ139902 – Newly acquired aircraft KC-46A requires capital improvement to existing facilities. This project modernizes building #251 by constructing a fuselage trainer. Project is unique to the Air National Guard and recommended **unilateral construction**.

20. NHANG PN SZCQ079043 – Replace existing airfield pavement on the southern half of the main apron at Pease. Project is unique to the Air National Guard and recommended **unilateral construction**.

21. NHANG PN SZCQ129555 Construct Entry Control Facility and reconfigure existing entrance to meet antiterrorism force protection standards for the safety and wellbeing of the personnel stationed at Pease. Project is unique to the Air National Guard and recommended **unilateral construction**.
