2. The following projects were discussed as possible joint use projects:

- a. **The North Carolina National Guard and the U.S. Army Reserve discussed the possibility of turning select National Guard Readiness Centers into joint use AFRC's. This action would reduce expenses incurred by the Army Reserve by leasing and maintaining separate facilities. USAR units could occupy excess NCARNG space creating a mutually beneficial relationship.**
- b. **The U.S. Marine Corps Reserve did not have an interest in exploring the possibility of joint use facilities.**
